INTRODUCTION

Our university is planned to specialise solely and unequivocally in the academic and practical study of every aspect of sport without exception. This includes the organisation and practical implementation of every aspect of the Olympic games and every other worldwide universal sports competition and sports medicine in its entirety.

Thus, we will be offering Bachelors and Masters degrees and Doctorates in Sports Science and Management.

Our aim is to make Zimbabwe the flourishing center for Africa and Internationally in the study of sport and sportsmanship.

Thus, the values, ethos, rules and professional practice in every sporting discipline will be covered. This wide sporting spectrum and study in Higher Education will therefore, comprise not only academic learning, but every aspect of physical fitness, well-being, training, the physiology and psychology of sport and sports medicine, as well as the infrastructure required for every different type of sport.

Accordingly, the university will teach every aspect of sports medicine including access to the latest AI driven robotics for injury rehabilitation.

The ethos of the university will include the precepts so eloquently described by the ancient Greeks when they created the Olympic movement and the Olympic Truce. This ethos and its educational principles have also been described by Pierre de Coubertin, the founder of modern Olympic games, and by Nelson Mandela, by the International Olympic Committee (IOC) and the International Olympic Academy (IOC).

Africa's turn will inevitably come to hold the Olympic games. Then and in the interim, our graduates will be ready and well able professionally to implement the vast variety of skills and know how necessary to organise, sponsor and apply the plethora of different rules applicable to each sporting discipline - even in so far as concerns the design of sports fields, athletic tracks, pitches and stadia and other sports infrastructure.

Thus, we aim to become a world recognised and internationally accepted institution of higher learning for sports qualifications, skills and professional specialists in every aspect of sports.



Zimbabwe's long-standing contributions to the Olympic movement are already well known. Some of these include:

The 'gold' won by Zimbabwe women hockeyplayers at the Moscow Olympics in 1980 which took place in the year of Zimbabwe's Independence.

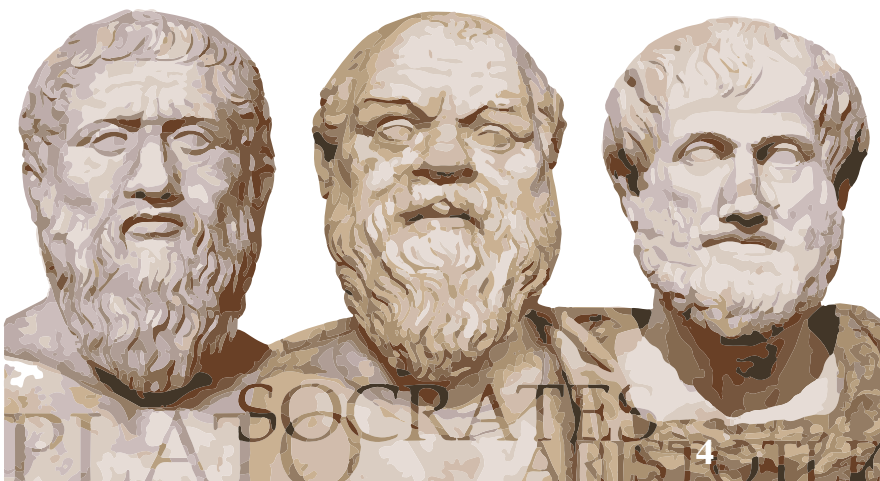
Kirsty Coventry's gold silver and bronze medals are records pers se and she now occupies the highest office in sport as President of the International Olympic Committee - and is the first African and woman in the world to have achieved this honour - an honour for Zimbabwe.

Zimbabwe's flourishing Zimbabwe Olympic Committee served by its present incumbent President Thabani Gonye has extended unequivocal support for the University. Other renowned sports administrators such as Thomas Sithole and the late Mark Manolios have become symbols of Zimbabwe's dedication to sport.

Many Africans have contributed and continue to contribute to every aspect of the Olympic games and to every other internationally recognised sporting authority. African competitors to Olympic games and other international games have achieved world records and are legendary.

We have applied to ZIMCHE for accreditation and thus we await formal registration.

There is no doubt that the universal penchant for sport and for major games competitions will allow the raising of funds that will enable the construction of the university on a piece of land which will be set aside for acquisition.





The Hellenic University of Africa has concluded a joint cooperation programme with the University of the Peloponnese in Greece whereby an internationally recognisable content for its first degree - a Bachelor of Sports Science and Management - will be awarded'. We therefore anticipate that this first Bachelor's degree will be ready for students in time for the first semester of 2027, that begins in August 2026.

The largest of institutions, we recall, started out modestly and thereafter grew exponentially. This is exactly what we anticipate for the Hellenic University of Africa. However, our joint endeavour with its cooperation between universities will also have wider permanent beneficial implications.

We most respectfully look forward to the establishment of our Hellenic University of Africa and we earnestly believe that this will give rise to international recognition of Zimbabwe's educational contribution to sport. To the best of our knowledge and belief there is no other university in the whole of the African continent that specialises exclusively in providing for Africa's desire for sport and sport competitions of every description.

AIMS AND OBJECTIVES OF HELLENIC UNIVERSITY OF AFRICA

1. GREECE may be one of the smaller countries of Europe in size and population numbers BUT
2. GREECE is a Cultural Super Power
3. ZIMBABWE may be one of the smaller countries of Africa in size and population BUT is said to have one of the highest per capital literacy rates in Africa.
4. The need for Tertiary Education in Africa let alone in the SADCC Region of which ZIMBABWE is a pivotal member is absolutely huge as is evidenced by the estimates handed down at the 2018 African Union's Education Conference as follows:
 - a) An estimated ten (10) million African students every year are ready for a post school and/or Tertiary Education.
 - b) Whereas it is estimated that approximately 26% of post school students in the developed world undertake further College or Technical or Tertiary Education, in Africa only an estimated 6% of post school students have that privilege.



c) Accordingly, it is estimated that Africa needs, at this time, some 600 additional Tertiary Institutions.

5. Africa has a penchant for sport - especially for soccer and long distance running and Africa continues to produce world class athletes. At present there is no university in Africa that concentrates solely on sport. Greece is foremost in the world in every aspect of the Olympic games which include the Winter Olympics and Para-Olympics. Since ancient times Greece and Africa, mostly through Egypt, have worked together. Hence the relevance of our African relationship with Greece and the Olympic games.
6. The role of Greece in Tertiary Education is of the highest standard in the world. Also, perhaps not as universally well-known is the immense contribution of Greeks in the diaspora to Tertiary Education in the USA, Britain and other countries.
7. The establishment of an Hellenic Tertiary Organisation in Zimbabwe is a natural progression from the spectacular academic success of the Hellenic Academy in Harare which caters for both a Primary and Secondary Education only. However, the Hellenic University of Africa will be a totally independent institution functioning on its own sole endeavours. It has no financial or administrative nexus whatsoever with the Harare and District Hellenic Community.
8. The Hellenic University of Africa will seek to become and to be the Premier Sports Academic and Cultural Establishment For Zimbabwe And For SADCC and for Africa.

It aims to produce graduates whose qualifications will be internationally recognised.

It aims to become one of the leading research intensive Universities in Africa in sport.

It will enhance the lives of individuals especially youth and sequentially, the communities and indeed countries in which they live and work and will produce leaders in every field of sporting endeavour and development.

The Hellenic University of Africa will seek a close interactive partnership with the International Olympic Academy of Olympia in Greece whose universal appeal accords entirely with its own aims, values and aspirations. There is no doubt that academic



learning in Sport couples with the physical practice of Sport and thereby inspires peace, stability and unity. We repeat Nelson Mandela's famous saying.

PRELIMINARY PLANNING DETAILS

1. The Hellenic University of Zimbabwe (now awaiting ZIMCHE accreditation) has concluded a joint venture with the University of Peloponnese of Greece. (This joint venture is called ***‘THE SPORTS UNIVERSITY OF AFRICA’***).
2. Academic and practical teaching is scheduled commence in the first semester of 2027 in terms of a Bachelor of Science Honours Degree in Sports Science and Management.
3. **VISION**
 - a. As a first for Africa our vision is to establish a world class African-born university of excellence combining modern sports science education with scientific management and character formation with special emphasis on youth and community service thus, producing graduates equipped to lead in sport and international sporting events and sports medicine.
 - b. To inspire business integrity and excellent management across the continent of Africa and the world.
 - c. To build strategic partnerships with international sports bodies, universities, and local ministries
4. **MISSION**
 - a. To unleash the transformative power of sport and to spread Christian and Olympic values through education.
 - b. To transform sport into an engine of sustainable economic growth and social development and to produce a new generation of educated professionals who combine integrity with knowledge, discipline and leadership.
 - c. Through sports medicine in all its disciplines to contribute to community health and especially youth development, public fitness and training centres.

To follow Olympic values and Christian ideals.
6. **RATIONALE**

Africa’s youth population is the largest in the world, yet investment in sports science, performance management, sports medicine and sports-based entrepreneurship remains minimal.

- Advance sports medicine and athletic health,
- Foster professionalism and governance in sports administration,
- Promote social cohesion and national pride through healthy living.

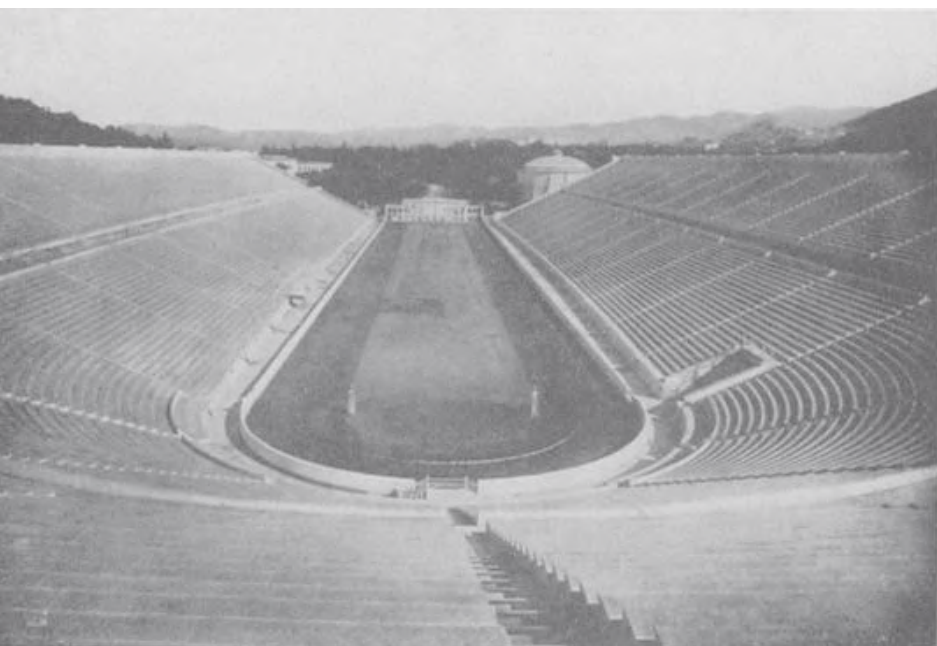

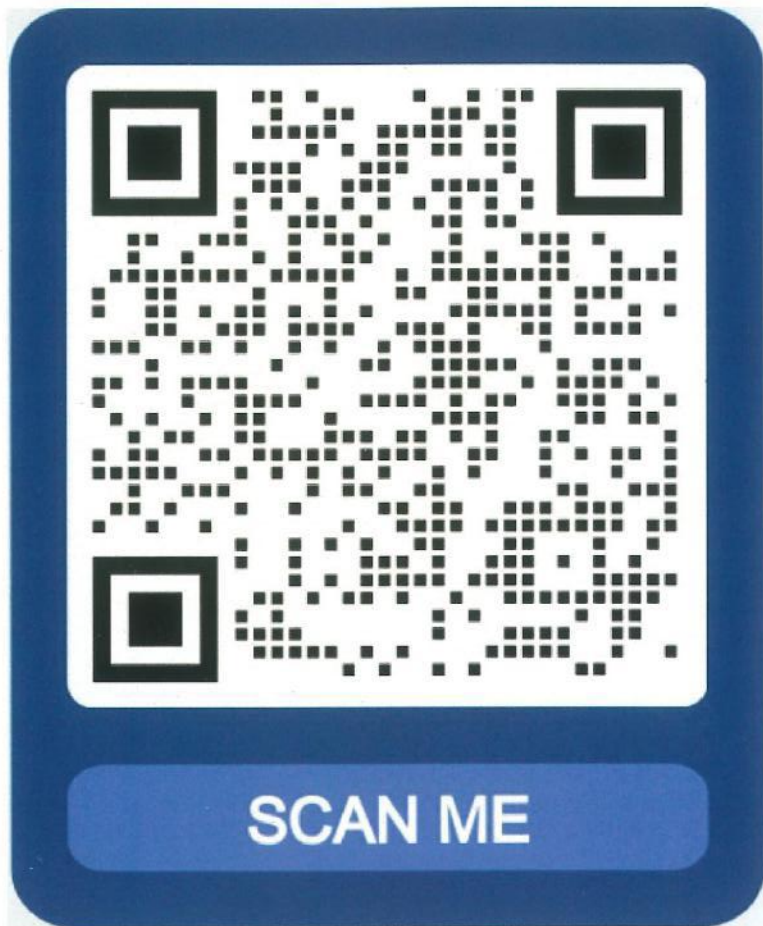
